## **Holiday Travel Tips**

Thanksgiving week at Sacramento International Airport is underway, and airport officials are recommending that passengers plan ahead when traveling this week. The latest projections show that Wednesday, November 21 and Sunday, November 25 will be the busiest days of the week, with approximately 40,000 passengers expected on both days.

To help passengers cope with holiday travel the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) released a new set of travel tips, called SimpliFLY, this week. TSA recommends packing neatly and organizing carry-on luggage in

To help travelers enjoy the holiday season, Sacramento International Airport offers the following tips:

- Arrive in the terminal at least 2 hours prior for domestic flights (2.5 hours prior for International flights).
- Obey all traffic and speed limit signs. Do not park or stop on airport roads.

- If you are picking up or dropping off passengers, park in the hourly lots free for 30 minutes.
- If parking at the airport, lock your vehicle and do not leave valuables in plain view.
- Pack liquids, gels and aerosols in checked baggage.
- Pack electronic equipment, including MP3 players, laptops, and cameras, in your carry-on luggage. For carry-on luggage, follow the 3-1-1 rule. Each passenger can bring one clear quart-size zip-top bag holding 3 ounce or smaller containers of liquids or gels.
- Check your airline's Web site for information on luggage restrictions.
- Call ahead to your airline for the latest flight information, in case of delays or changes.
